

## Abstract:

This paper focuses on the potentials of a conceptual digital construction of a Amphitheatre for Roman multiple screens. I argue that current 'historically accurate' digital depictions of Roman amphitheaters are limited to lifeless and sanitized aerial 3D models, and that new methodological tools can add layers of understanding to our contemporary knowledge of the Roman spectacle: A participatory and multisensory digital recreation of a Roman amphitheatre can engineer deeper and constructive analyses of the dynamics and systemic operations regarding (ancient current) popular entertainment. It can furthermore generate questions about the potentials and limitations set by our current technological grasp.
